


# **Birchgrove Primary School**

## **April 2024 Newsletter**



Welcome back to the start of the summer term which is always a busy and exciting one. Although the spring term was a very short one this year we certainly packed a lot in. Following the visit from Estyn at the end of February the final report will be published on May 1<sup>st</sup>. You will be sent a copy on this day through our usual channels. I will not actually be in school that week myself as I shall be accompanying a group of children from years 4 and 5 on their visit to a school in Murcia.

Attendance in school is extremely important to ensure that children achieve their full potential. Our school target for this year is to have attendance of at least 96% across the school. For the spring term the figures for each class were as follows. Unfortunately these were very disappointing:

CONGRATULATIONS to 3J for being at the top of the league table and the only class to exceed our school target for the term. The figure for the whole school since September is 95.4% which is below our target. Hopefully we will see a big improvement through the summer term with less illness and fewer holidays being taken.

We are still in a critical position regarding our breakfast club. To ensure that this free facility is able to continue in September we need to secure a long term solution to staffing. If you or anyone you know are interested in this role please ask them to contact the school office. If you have children who attend the school they would be able to attend breakfast club with you. Without the necessary recruitment we will once again have to consider the viability and possible restrictions on numbers for September.
